- ✓ Personal belongings includes property owned or used for church business purposes
- ✓ Guests personal belongings cover includes the personal belongings of visitors to the home and the most we will pay for any one claim is increased to £5,000 £ 2,500 more than our standard contents insurance
- ✓ Any exclusion of loss or damage caused after your home has been continuously unoccupied or unfurnished for more than 60 days, is increased from 60 days to 90 days
- ✓ Cover for secretaries under 'domestic' employees cover
- ✓ Theft cover is not restricted to forcible or violent entry or exit whilst the property is used in connection with their occupation, e.g. arrangements for weddings/christenings
- ✓ Even if you need to take out contents-only insurance because you are living in tied accommodation; you can still add cover for sheds and greenhouses, normally only included in a "buildings" policy
